(The 3^{rd} , 4^{th} and 5^{th} grade students will present a spring program to be held on March 16^{th} at the Middle School.)








"Giving a Little Makes a Big Difference!!!"





Book Fair Raises over \$1,000




BEYOND CRAYONS GRANT RECIPIENTS


WINTER CLOTHING EXPECTATIONS

Moving??? TUITION WAIVER

The intent of the tuition waiver is to solve the problem that occurs when students move out of the district after the open enrollment deadline. If your child meets the requirements and is granted the tuition waiver, he/she is allowed to remain in the district until the



following February when you are eligible to apply for open enrollment. You must apply for open enrollment during the next February-April application period in order for your child to continue attending D.C. Everest.

OPEN ENROLLMENT

Application period for the 2017 - 2018 school year is February 2 – April 28, 2017.

Wisconsin's inter-district public school open enrollment program allows parents to apply for their children to attend a school district other than the one in which they live. Parents must complete an online application no earlier than February 2, 2017, and no later than April 28, 2017 by 4:00 p.m. Late applications will not be accepted for any reason.

This web site will open on February 2, 2017 at 12:00 a.m. and close on April 28, 2017 at 4:00 p.m.

At this time, once a student is accepted to attend D.C. Everest under open enrollment, the student may continue to attend the district without having to reapply every year.








CHECK OUT OUR LOST & FOUND



During the next few weeks of our Guidance classes, your child will be learning about something we call "The Zones of Regulation" (or "The Zones" for short). These lessons are designed to help your child understand feelings or emotions and help him/her gain skills for self-control and managing different emotions. Some examples of how emotions fit within the zones can be seen below.



Blue Zone	Green Zone	Yellow Zone	Red Zone
Sad Sick Tired Bored	Happy Calm Focused Ready to Learn	Frustrated Worried Silly Loss of some control	Mad/Angry Terrified Yelling/Hitting Out of Control

Through this program, students will gain an increased vocabulary of emotional terms, skills in reading other people's facial expressions, perspective about how others see and react to their behavior, insight into events that can trigger different emotions, calming and alerting strategies, and problem solving skills.

It is important to note that everyone experiences all of the zones -- the Red and Yellow Zones are not the "bad" or "naughty" zones. All of the zones are expected at one time or another depending on the situation. The goal of the program is to learn about the different emotions and strategies for dealing with feelings in healthy and productive ways that encourage the development of good social skills and healthy relationships.
