2017-2018 KINDERGARTEN REGISTRATION

All Children who will be five years of age on or before September 1, 2017, are eligible for next year's kindergarten

class. Parents of students <u>new</u> to the District are asked to register their child for the 2017-18 school year.

Registration forms can be

obtained from the D.C. Everest website—www.dce.k12.wi.us or from the Riverside office. You will also need to bring your child's birth certificate or other appropriate documentary evidence and immunization record. You do not need to bring your kindergarten eligible child. If you know of a neighbor or friend that may not receive this information, please have them call Riverside School at 715-359-2417.

4K Registration

Children 4 years of age on or before September 1, 2017 are eligible for the DC Everest 4K program. If you will be transporting your child, you may register at the 4K site of your preference, however, this preference is not a guarantee. If you require busing, you must register at your neighborhood 4K site. If you are unsure of the 4K site in your area, please refer to the 4K site map on the DC Everest website. Please bring your child's original birth certificate or other appropriate documentary evidence and immunization record when registering.



PARENT-TEACHER CONFERENCES

Parent-Teacher Conferences will be held March 9, March 10 and March 14th. The time and day for conferences will be similar to those that were scheduled for your family in November. **Notices of conference times will be sent home with students on February 20th**. If you need to make changes to your conference times or would like to schedule a time with our guidance counselor or art, music and phy ed teachers, you can go online using the access code included with your schedule or by calling the school office at 715-359-2417, ext. 5321.



Moving???

The intent of the tuition waiver is to solve the problem that occurs when students move out of the district after the open enrollment deadline. If your child meets the requirements and is granted the tuition waiver, he/she is allowed to remain in the district until the following February when you are eligible to apply for open enrollment. You must apply for open enrollment during the next February-April application period in order for your child to continue attending D.C. Everest.

OPEN ENROLLMENT

Application period for the 2017 - 2018 school year is February 2 – April 28, 2017. Wisconsin's inter-district public school open enrollment program allows parents to apply for their children to attend a school district other than the one in which they live. Parents must complete an online application no earlier than February 2, 2017, and no later than April 28, 2017 by 4:00 p.m. Late applications will not be accepted for any reason.

This web site will open on February 2, 2017 at 12:00 a.m. and close on April 28, 2017 at 4:00 p.m.

At this time, once a student is accepted to attend D.C. Everest under open enrollment, the student may continue to attend the district without having to reapply every year.

2017 Riverside "Giants in Science"

Date: March 16, 2017 Time: 9:00 (Grades K-4) & 1:00 (Grade 5)

That's right! It's time to start thinking about this year's science fair. Riverside's "Giants in Science" science fair has become quite a tradition that amazes visitors every year.

Why have a Science Fair?

First of all, it's a blast! Secondly, it offers students many benefits. It:

- Stimulates imagination and independent thinking
- Increases knowledge in many scientific areas
- Teaches the use of the processes of science
- Trains in the organization and completion of major tasks
- Provides the opportunity to enjoy science



The science fair will be similar to last year in many ways. For example, all 5th graders will still be required to have a project. Students in grades K-4 have the option to participate, and are encouraged to do so.

Students have a choice of three different themes to choose from:

- 1. Scientific Inquiry-Focusing on a question about science and then using the scientific method to help answer the question.
- 2. Original Invention- Create an invention that will solve a special problem or need that would make the world a better place.
- 3. Research a Scientist-Choose a scientist that has changed the way we live. Students will learn about a scientist's life and what he or she contributed to science.

*Once again, all exhibits must include a hands-on project to enhance the display.

If the science fair sounds fun to you and you think you'd like to participate in it, fill out the entry form below and return it to your homeroom teacher. Students that register will receive an informational packet to help with the process of putting together an awesome project.
