RIVERSIDE SPELLING BEE

ADVANCED LEARNER/CHALLENGE PROGRAM NOMINATION PERIOD

The nomination period for the 2018-19 Advanced Learner/Challenge Program Magnet Program will begin on January 22 and runs through February 26th. The D.C. Everest Advanced Learner/Challenge Program is open to students in 2nd through 5th grade and is housed

at Riverside Elementary. In addition to an accelerated curriculum, emphasis is placed on the higher level cognitive skills, problem solving, logic, and creativity. Students selected for placement in the program need to acquire academic knowledge quickly, apply this knowledge in creative and productive ways, and demonstrate a strong desire to learn. Parents and teachers are encouraged to nominate students in 1st through 4th grades who have demonstrated advanced academic capabilities. Nomination forms will be available in elementary school offices on January 22.

2018-2019 KINDERGARTEN REGISTRATION

All children who will be five years of age on or before September 1, 2018, are eligible for next year's kindergarten class. Parents of students **new** to the District are asked to register their child for the 2018-19 school year. Registration forms can be obtained from the D.C. Everest website—www.dce.k12.wi.us or from the Riverside office. You will also need to bring your child's birth certificate or other appropriate documentary evidence and immunization record. You do not need to bring your kindergarten eligible child. If you know of a neighbor or friend that may not receive this information, please have them call Riverside School at 715-359-2417.

WINTER PARENT-TEACHER CONFERENCES: A New Approach

Parent teacher conferences will be on Feb. 20 from 4:15 pm - 8:00 pm and again Feb. 22 from 9:00 am - 7:00 pm. We want to share with you a new format to our Parent Teacher Conferences that all elementary schools will be following. Now that fall conferences are behind us and every parent has met with their classroom teacher(s), the winter conferences will be structured differently. In order to allow more time for indepth conversations for those students and parents who might benefit, teachers will select a number of parents for whom a 30minute conference would be beneficial. These parents will receive an email with instructions to register online for a 30-minute conference from Jan 26th – 31st. For these 30-minute conferences, classroom teachers will invite other staff who may be offering additional supports to the student so that conversations can take place that are comprehensive in nature. Parents who have not been notified for a 30-minute conference will be given the opportunity to register online for an OPTIONAL 15-minute conference from Feb. 7th-14th. Every parent who wants a conference will get one, and those who might need more time to talk will get that as well. We hope this new structure will afford parents and teachers the time needed to more adequately meet the needs of all students. TUITION WAIVER

The intent of the tuition waiver is to solve the problem that occurs when students move out of the district after the open enrollment deadline.

If your child meets the requirements and is granted the tuition waiver, he/she is allowed to remain in the district until the following February when you are eligible to apply for open enrollment. You must apply fo



enrollment. You must apply for open enrollment during the next February-April application period in order for your child to continue attending D.C. Everest.

OPEN ENROLLMENT

Application period for the 2018 - 2019 school year is February 5 – April 30, 2018.

Wisconsin's inter-district public school open enrollment program allows parents to apply for

their children to attend a school district other than the one in which they live. Parents must complete an online application no earlier than February 5, 2018, and no later than April 30, 2018 by 4:00 p.m. <u>Late applications will not be accepted for any reason.</u>

This web site will open on February 5, 2018 at 12:00 a.m. and close on April 30, 2018 at 4:00 p.m.

At this time, once a student is accepted to attend D.C. Everest under open enrollment, the student may continue to attend the district without having to reapply every year.

2018 Riverside "Giants in Science"

Date: March 15, 2018 Time: 9:00 (Grades K-4) & 1:00 (Grade 5)

That's right! It's time to start thinking about this year's science fair. Riverside's "Giants in Science" science fair has become quite a tradition that amazes visitors every year.



Why have a Science Fair?

First of all, it's a blast! Secondly, it offers students many benefits. It:

- Stimulates imagination and independent thinking
- Increases knowledge in many scientific areas
- Teaches the use of the processes of science
- Trains in the organization and completion of major tasks
- Provides the opportunity to enjoy science

The science fair will be similar to last year in many ways. For example, all 5th graders will still be required to have a project. Students in grades K-4 have the option to participate, and are encouraged to do so.

Students have a choice of three different themes to choose from:

- 1. Scientific Inquiry- Focusing on a question about science and then using the scientific method to help answer the question.
- 2. Original Invention- Create an invention that will solve a special problem or need that would make the world a better place.
- 3. Research a Scientist- Choose a scientist that has changed the way we live. Students will learn about a scientist's life and what he or she contributed to science.

*Once again, all exhibits must include a hands-on project to enhance the display.
